# Forming the Flock

WITH DEACON BILL SCHNEIDER



## Conversion Sunday

All of us are anxiously waiting, waiting patiently for spring. It has been a long, rather wet, and cold winter! Change is coming—you can just feel it in your bones. The days are starting to get brighter and longer. The sun feels warm on our faces when we are out walking. There is a new season coming, a new time, a promise of something better. Hope does spring eternal in the human heart. It is a time to know and appreciate God's care, concern and love for us. That is what the story about the woman at the well is all about. It is a beautiful story. It is about change and conversion, a turning away from the old in order to embrace the new. It is about a fresh awareness of what God is in our daily lives.

There is much we can learn from this story. First of all, it is Jesus who begins this conversation at the well. It is always God who breaks into our daily lives with His invitation of love. It is not that we suddenly decide to change on our own. It is by invitation, and we are called to respond to that invitation. Before the alcoholic or drug addict can mend his ways, he must come to the realization that there is a greater power outside of himself and then he must let that power take charge of his life. All conversion, even the very desire to change, is a gift, freely given. And even more, it is a slow and gradual process; never sudden or overnight. It is the work of the Spirit and it is a work which lasts a lifetime. Saint or sinner, it makes no difference because all of us are called to an ongoing conversion.

The woman at the well goes through this process before she recognizes that Jesus is the Messiah. She wonders why this man even speaks to her—a woman and a Samaritan! Then she is curious about Him. This gradual awareness of who Jesus is begins the process of conversion. To know the Lord is to accept His ways, and in knowing His ways, to strive to become a disciple. In other words, changes in my day-to-day behavior are caused by my daily experience of the Lord.

The woman tells us even more about conversion. The woman knew she had sinned, but she also knows now she is forgiven, loved by God and challenged to a whole new way of life. Having experienced Jesus' healing grace, she goes off to tell others about what has happened to her. She wants to share that experience with the world. We could say that, by her change of attitude, she has become an evangelizer.

We are almost at the halfway mark in our journey through Lent, our time of change and conversion. Our daily choices, our faithfulness and all of our dying to selfishness and sin remind us of the good works that God has begun in each of us. He will see that good work brought to its completion.

All we need to do is to sit by the well, be open to God's invitation to a new life and then become more aware of His love. The rest follows just as spring follows winter. We are to stand before the person of the living God, and let Him be God for us because that is exactly what He wants to be.



# IMAGES OF FAITH

WITH LARRY FRAHER, PH.D.

Sébastien Bourdon's "Christ and the Samaritan Woman" offers us an interesting depiction of the story. Where most others focus on the first interactions between the woman and Christ, this painting focuses on the post-encounter events, presenting the Samaritan woman as the evangelist for her village. Seen in blue and white, standing next to the reclining Christ, she is pointing Him out to those from the town who have come to see Jesus. The apostles observe, gathered together in the lower left corner of the painting: John in the red and Peter in the white, seemingly disinterested and facing the viewer as he pulls at a loaf of bread. On the lower right are several women who have come to see this man; one carries a child in her arms, while another points out the interaction between the Samaritan woman and Christ. In the center of the painting are the men of the town, presumably leaders, who stand before Christ and the woman, realizing the truth of her testimony. The background of the painting offers a presentation of the gospel amid a 17th century classical French landscape that frames the action and draws the eyes to the central characters.



Bourdon, who was a Calvinist, attempts to portray the very personal experience and subsequent evangelizing work of the woman. The artist's own faith focuses on an individual encounter with Christ that empowers to evangelization. She has gone to tell others of the encounter, and now they come to see for themselves. Standing before her peers, she points the way to Christ. He had told her everything she had ever done; she has come to know her need for this One who is also "Living Water." Through her experience, God has revealed the promised Messiah, and now she proclaims to the others, "Come and meet the man who told me everything I have done." Reactions are varied: some question while others seem ready and willing accept her testimony, coming to believe for themselves. The Church offers us this reading as we move toward Easter and prepare those in RCIA who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Just like the Samaritan woman, those to be baptized and all of us must ask of Christ: "Give us living water."

The image and text invite us to reflect: Who points me to Christ? What do I thirst for? Am I willing to discover how Christ can fulfill my thirsts? How might I become a person who points others to Christ? Through my attachment to Him, what might I do to share Living Water in a thirsty world?

## Saint of the Week Venerable Eusebio Francesco Kino



Venerable Eusebio Francesco Chini, S.J. is more commonly known as Father Kino. He was born in 1645 in Tyrol, a state of the Holy Roman Empire that is now divided between modern-day Italy and Austria. In 1665, he joined the Society of Jesus and became a Jesuit priest in 1677. He served most of his vocation as a prolific missionary and built missions and ranches extending 50,000 square miles through what is now Mexico to present day California and Arizona.

A skilled cartographer, Father Kino drew the first accurate maps of the Gulf of California and Baja California. These maps remained the most accurate maps of this region 150 years after his death, until more powerful tools for cartography were invented. Through his travels, he encountered 16 different native tribes and developed relationships with each, often trading European seeds and edible plants as well as cattle, sheep, and goats.

Aside from his work building missions and serving the local peoples he encountered, Father Kino was also a skilled astronomer and mathematician. During his first attempt to travel to New Spain, now the Americas, he unfortunately missed his ship, causing him to spend an entire year in southern Spain in the coastal city of Cádiz, before he could reembarc. He spent that year observing a comet—later known as Kirch's comet—and published his findings in his astronomical treatise, "Exposición Astronómica de el Cometa," or in English, the Astronomical Exposure of the Comet. He mentions in this treatise that, with the hope of being a missionary in the Americas, he dedicated his life to Our Lady of Guadalupe as news of the apparition in Mexico a little over 100 years earlier was influencing Spanish culture.

After establishing over 25 missions, championing the rights of the native peoples he encountered through his opposition to slavery, and constructing 19 villages to supply cattle and seed to nearby settlements, Father Kino died of a severe fever on March 15, 1711. He is often depicted in art and sculpture on horseback as that was his main mode of transportation across the American West. Pope Francis advanced the cause of Venerable Eusebio Francesco Chini—Father Kino—on July 11, 2020.
